# Governor Pen Portrait

Every week I will be including pen portraits from our Governors so you can get to know them. This week, our Co-opted Governor, Sam Whyte, introduces herself. Sam joined our Governing Body in 2019 and is our Safeguarding Governor and also oversees LAC (looked after children), School attendance, PSHE (personal, social, health and economic education and RSE (Relationships and Sex Education).

## Sam Whyte

My name is Sam Whyte and I'm the Lead Safeguarding Governor on Witley Infant School's Governing Body.

As the lead safeguarding governor, I'm responsible for holding the school to account for how it keeps children at Witley safe, and this includes how staff and volunteers are supported to identify and respond to any concerns



about children's safety and wellbeing, and how we teach children about keeping safe (online and offline) and developing healthy relationships. There's a genuine commitment at Witley to instil a positive safeguarding culture at our school in partnership with our students, parents, staff and governors, and it has been a privilege in my role to be able to support the school to be the best it can be for children.

I became a school governor at Witley in summer 2019 as I wanted to be able to do more to support the school and the local community, and I've been delighted through the governing body to continue to do this now my own children have moved on to junior school. In the "real world", I'm a working mum of two boys, living in Witley and very much embracing village life.

In my day job, I've spent over 15 years working in children's charities, including at Unicef UK, advocating for the rights of children and young people; and now for a national safeguarding training and consultancy organisation working with schools, universities, victims' services and policing to improve how they support children and adults.
