This can be done most effectively when all staff, parents and children understand their responsibilities and work together towards the same goals.

Our Governing Body will ensure that:

- the school provides care and safety for every pupil and member of staff
- safeguarding is part of everyday life to protect each child from harm
- the school strives to give the best education for every pupil and puts inclusion at the heart of its learning
- school policies are reviewed regularly to reflect the ethos of Witley C of E Infant School
- funding received by the school will be used efficiently to support learning
- governors visit the school regularly and make it a priority to raise academic standards in the school
- governors meet regularly to carry out their legal responsibilities

Our School will do its best to:

- provide a safe, secure and caring learning environment for all
- teach and encourage each child to do their best and achieve their full potential as a valued member of the school community
- promote our school values for our children to develop a loving and a caring attitude towards the school, community and the wider environment
- provide a balanced curriculum of the highest quality and meet the individual needs of every child
- provide home learning and give feedback if appropriate

- inform children and parents/carers what we aim to teach the children each term
- be welcoming and offer opportunities for parents/carers to become involved in the daily life of the school
- where appropriate contact parents/carers as soon as concerns are raised about a child's learning, behaviour, attendance or punctuality
- have a clear and consistent approach to rewards and sanctions for children as set out in the Behaviour Policy
- communicate between home and school through notices, newsletters, website and general meetings

Parents/Carers will work together with our school to:

- ensure your child attends school regularly, is punctual and properly equipped and ready to learn
- inform the school office on each morning of absence, providing a reason
- collect your child punctually, and advise the school if they are going to be late or if there is a change to the collection arrangements at the end of the day
- raise any concerns or problems with your class teacher that might impact your child's ability to learn or behave appropriately
- support the school to make sure your child understands the expected behaviour within the school grounds as set out in the behaviour policy
- support your child with home learning and listen to your child read daily
- attend parent meetings with the teacher to discuss your child's achievements and progress
- support all staff in their efforts to create a caring community which values the rights of all
- work collaboratively with our school to access support that your child may need
- read all correspondence including letters, messages, emails that are sent home
- all administrative communication to be directed to the office email or the office post box which is situated by the main entrance
- inform the school immediately in writing of any changes to parents/carer and emergency contacts details
- support the school ethos in the wider community and through positive social media
- follow the school policy and procedures relating to the use of mobile devices and media
- work with the school to help your child understand online safety at home and at school
- ensure careful and considerate parking at the school entrances and respect safety regulations on school premises

- allow others in class to learn effectively, by following the school, classroom and playground rules ensuring that everyone is safe and happy
