## NEWS FROM FWS

Hello all, we made it to the end of term - hopefully you're not crawling to the finish line! Well done everyone! FWS have had a great half term thanks in no small part to all of you.

Our focus has been almost entirely on the Christmas Grotto and Market last weekend. We're still taking down lights and washing Elf costumes but it was so worth it!

Our heartfelt thanks to all our volunteers for the set up on Friday and Saturday you were all so good humoured and massively helpful while we ran around like crazy people. We literally couldn't have been ready on Saturday without you and it meant so much to us to have a steady stream of people turning up to help.

And of course huge thanks to our 15 elves and all the volunteers who staffed the market. Elves you stepped out of your comfort zones and made magic for the kids and we love you for it! And the bar and bbq volunteers did such a good job - it's not easy making drinks with a hose in a muddy field but you did it!! Thank you all.

We hope you all enjoyed the event as much as we did we're super proud of it and hope the children will remember it for years to come.

This half term we have raised £1275 which added to last half term makes £3448 in total:

£211 on the Spare Change Competition - £90 of this has gone to Save The Children who are usually the recipient of the Christmas Jumper Day money - however this year you brought bottles so we donated £90 from the spare change funds.

£1064 on The Christmas Market and Grotto. This event cost a lot to set up so we are chuffed that it also raised so much after costs.

FWS has funded the following for our school:

- £190 on Andy Hiccup, The Christmas Entertainer and Magician
- £90 donation to Save The Children
- £505 on the school Amazon Wishlist which this half term included books, forest school equipment and more!

Mrs Szczepanski is trialling a new horse shoe shaped reading table in the classrooms for group reading and if this is a success FWS will be paying for all the classrooms to have them.

In addition our school has asked for an additional large sail to provide shade in the playground and we are looking into a new microphone and speaker system so that we can hear all our children in the varying performances they work so hard on. ### News from Surrey County Council

Is your child starting school in September 2024?

Is your child in Year 2?

In an effort to minimise the number of late applications received, SCC would like to remind parents, **including parents with pre-school siblings**, that the closing date for Reception and Junior applications for September 2024 entry is **15 January 2024**.

It would be much appreciated, in the hope that parents will complete an application over the Christmas holidays if they have not already.

For infant schools, this will include reminding parents of children on roll in Year 2 that they must submit an application **by 15 January** for a junior transfer.

We encourage online applications

via <u>https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/eAdmissions/app</u>, however parents can also request a paper application form or seek impartial help in completing an application via the Surrey Schools & Childcare Service (0300 200 1004, Mon-Fri 9am-5pm).

Full information is available on Surrey's website at <u>www.surreycc.gov.uk/primaryadmissions</u>.

Applications received after the closing date without good reason will be treated as late and will not be considered until all on time applications have been processed. This may jeopardise the chance of a parent being offered one of their preferred schools for their child. We will **only** consider an application as on-time even if it has been made late if there is a genuine reason why the application could not reasonably have been made before the closing date. If the child lives in another local authority, they should make an on-time application which can include Surrey schools, to that local authority, even if they know they will be moving. #### If you're not in a crisis, but still need support ...

If you do not need urgent support, you can talk to your mental health lead in school. They are there to listen and support you with your mental health and wellbeing. If you do not know who this is, talk to a member of school staff you trust and they will be able to help you.

Visit our website, <u>www.mindworks-surrey.org</u> - this offers a wide range of information which can help your mental health and wellbeing. We have resources such as <u>My Safety Plan</u> and <u>self-help tips</u> to help guide you through your wellbeing during challenging times. You'll find links to useful websites, recommended reading, plus coping strategies to help you through difficult times.

We are partnered with Kooth, who are a digital mental health platform providing confidential support for all young people. Here you can access forums, activity centres, messaging and live counselling. You can get support when you need it, with no waiting lists or need to be referred by an adult. Sometimes it might feel easier to message/ text about how you are feeling and there are many places you can do this:

<u>Shout</u>: is a free, confidential, 24/7 text support service for anyone in the UK who is struggling to cope. To start a conversation, text the word 'SHOUT' to 85258.

<u>Chat Health</u>: is a safe and easy way for you to speak to a qualified health professional. They provide information
about services near you that can provide support. Contact them through their website <u>www.chathealth.nhs.uk</u>

<u>The CYP (Children & Young People) Haven</u> is a safe space for any child or young people aged 10-18 to go where they can talk about worries and mental health in a confidential, friendly and supportive place. Scan the QR code for more information.
